CBD Key dates

- Signature : 5th June 1992
- Entry into force : 29th December 1993
- Members : 196

The objectives of this Convention, to be pursued in accordance with its relevant provisions, are the **conservation of biological diversity**, the **sustainable use of its components** and the **fair and equitable sharing of the benefits arising out of the utilization of genetic resources**, including by appropriate access to genetic resources and by appropriate transfer of relevant technologies, taking into account all rights over those resources and to technologies, and by appropriate funding.



CBD Key dates

Sustainable use :

- Cartagena Protocol : 29th January 2000 / 11th September 2003
- Kuala Lumpur Supplementary Protocol : 15th October 2010 / 5th March 2018

Fair and equitable sharing :

- Nagoya Protocol : 29th October 2010 / 12th October 2014

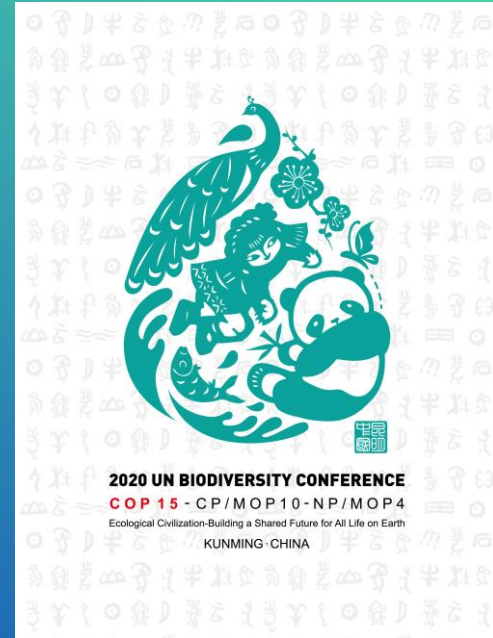


A new Global Strategy

- Aichi Targets : 2010-2020
- 5 strategic goals and 20 targets

“Deeply concerned that, despite many positive actions by Parties and others, most of the Aichi Biodiversity Targets are not on track to be achieved by 2020, which, in the absence of further significant progress, will jeopardize the achievement of the mission and vision of the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020, and the Sustainable Development Goals, and ultimately the planet’s life support systems”

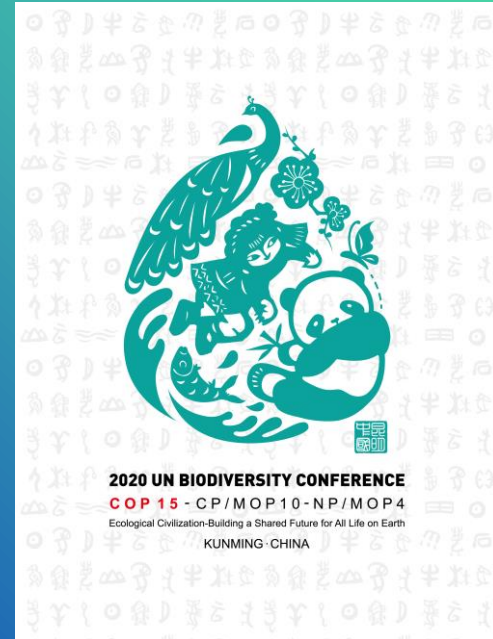

A new Global Strategy

- Kunming-Montréal GBF : 2022 - 2030
- 4 goals and 23 targets

The vision of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework is a world of living in harmony with nature where “by 2050, biodiversity is valued, conserved, restored and wisely used, maintaining ecosystem services, sustaining a healthy planet and delivering benefits essential for all people.”

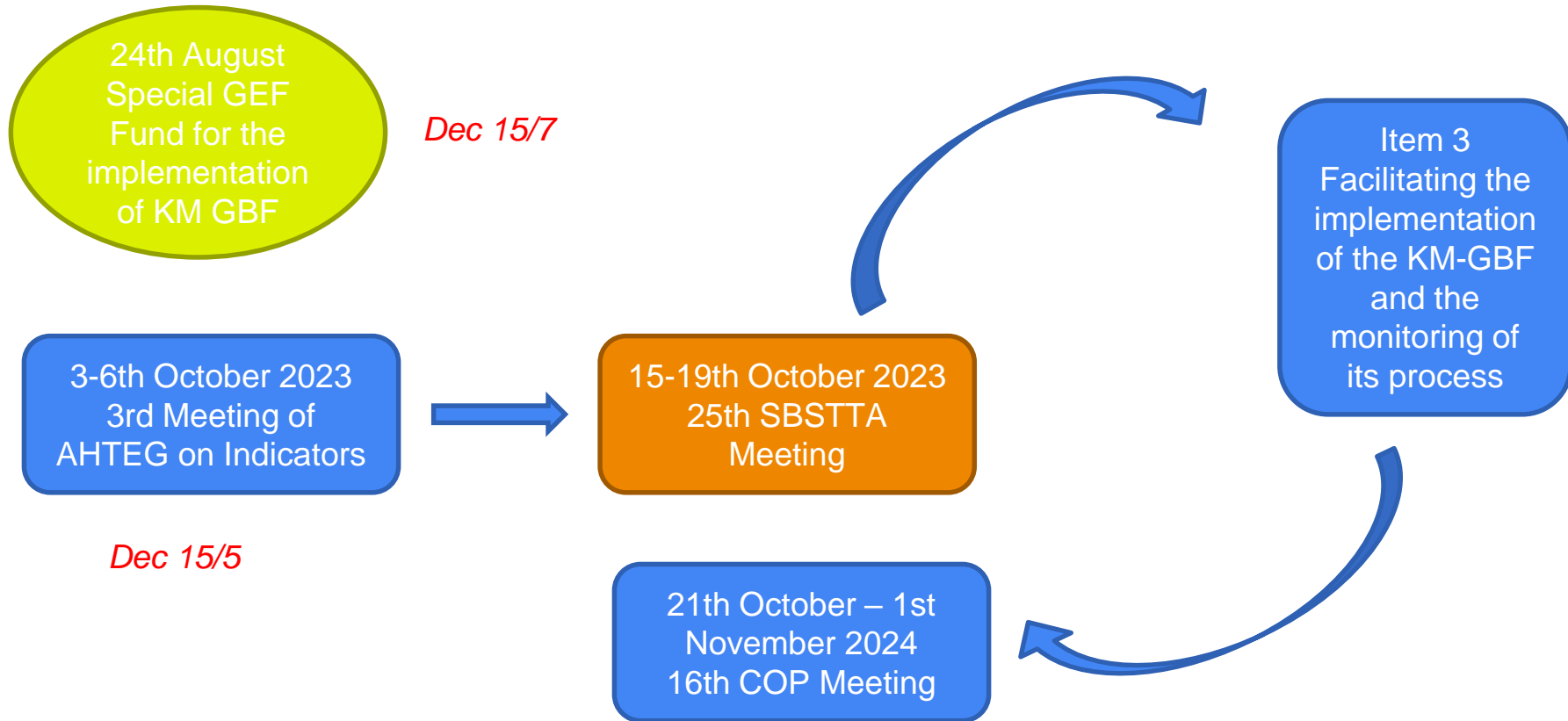
Decision 15/5 : Monitoring framework for the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework
