

# Key achievements of the GSPC

- Mobilised the plant conservation community
- National responses by a number of countries (including mega-diverse countries)
- Framework for action with clear, easily understood, quantifiable targets
- Global targets as a guide for national targets – but flexibility at national level
- Stimulated *action* at both global and national levels
- Botanic gardens and arboreta as key players


